Dear Barry,

I hope you had a good trip.

I am a little surprised by your reply on the project documents. I don't think there were any maps in the list I requested from you. In any case, presumably if they are available to view in Ankara, then they are mostly not restricted?

It is obviously not practical for us to travel to Ankara. My colleagues and I have been reading the ESIA in detail, and have noticed that large sections of it rely heavily on data and explanations of BTC's approach which are set out in these other documents. We are very keen to build up an accurate picture of the pipeline impacts, and without those supporting documents, many sections of the ESIA are impossible to assess.

All of the documents I listed are referenced in the ESIA, most were carried out as part of the ESIA, and for the reasons above, we regard them as an essential element of it.

I should be grateful if you would send me as soon as possible those documents which are not problematic. The others might take a few days longer if you need to remove confidential sections.
